Paul Abel proposed that Nottingham City Council could site cycle racks in on-street parking bays outside Houses in Multiple Occupation (where off-street cycle parking is inadequate) and charge the landlords for rental of the street parking bays. This could be done under the current Licenced Landlords scheme in Nottingham.

Paul Abel to re-write Blackspots press release in the light of no more NCC capital funding for cycling infrastructure.

Paul Abel read out responses from Ken Clarke and Liz Plant regarding the new Melton Road Cycle Lane in West Bridgford..
