ACTION POINTS

1. Agreed not to renew our membership of CycleNation, as they had not responded to our message asking just why we should continue to be members.
2. The plans for the Broad Marsh redevelopment look encouraging. However, we need more details and we need to attend the stakeholder event which is planned for the New Year.
3. We need a minute taker for the 15 January meeting
4. We need to invite Inspector Mark Whitaker of Nottinghamshire Police to a future meeting (perhaps May/June) to discuss the Close Pass Campaign
5. We need to include an item on poor maintenance of cycle paths during icy weather for the 15 January meeting, and raise it with Cllr. Sally Longford.
6. We need to draw up a "Cyclists' Tube Map" (as other local cycle campaigners have done, eg. In Bristol, Bath and Derby), to show our ideas / aspirations for the local cycle network for the next 30 years and help feed our views into the emerging LCWIPs (Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Investment Plans)
7. Woodside Road: wait and see how the new improvements settle down before making any further comments.
8. Raise concerns about cycle direction and warning signage around the City end of the Suspension Bridge, and its approaches, at the next CDG meeting.
9. No volunteers came forward to represent Pedals at meetings concerning inclusivity, as requested by Andrew Martin, as he had first suggested at the last AGM but not had time to follow up himself.
10. We need a line including on the website which explains to people trying to contact Pedals that we are all volunteers and a response to their enquiry (via contact@pedals.org.uk) may take a few days.
11. It would be useful if new members could be given a Glossary of Abbreviations to help interpret the many abbreviations used in (local) cycling policy circles, e.g. 'The CDG'. This could perhaps be added to the existing, though long apparently dormant, FAQs section
